The SCO has requested that budget bill language and Control Section language be added to the 2014 Budget Act that will allow for additional legal-cost related expenditures, if needed. This request also includes trailer bill language that would extend the sunset date of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Project until June 30, 2017. The requested amendment would allow SCO to assess special funds within the state treasury for costs attributable to the replacement of the state payroll disbursement system.
