

## ERIN RICHES

Erin Riches is a consultant to the California State Senate Committee on Transportation and Housing, chaired by Senator Mark DeSaulnier (D-Concord). Ms. Riches is primarily responsible for bills related to a variety of issues, including driver's licensing and training, rules of the road, ports and goods movement, air quality, federal transportation funding, and airports and air travel.

Before joining the committee staff in January 2013, Ms. Riches worked for five and a half years as a policy consultant at the State Senate Office of Research, where she focused on housing, local government, land use, transportation, and veterans affairs issues.

From 1999 to 2007, Ms. Riches served as a policy analyst at the non-profit California Budget Project, focusing on issues including housing, local government, and transportation.

Immediately prior to that position, Ms. Riches was a legislative aide to then-Assemblymember Michael Sweeney. Ms. Riches began her career at the Assembly Speaker's Office of Majority Services and in the office of then-Assembly Speaker Willie L. Brown, Jr.

Ms. Riches earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in History and International Relations from the University of California, Davis and her Master of Public Policy and Administration from California State University, Sacramento.
