**Governor:** The Governor's budget redirects the Proposition 47 savings into other DSH needs, and there are no related proposals in the Governor's Budget.

**Governor:** There are no related proposals in the Governor's Budget, with the exception of outpatient drugs, for which the Administration proposed trailer bill to authorize DHCS to establish new dispensing fees. Both houses approved of the proposed trailer bill.

### Issue 5: Homelessness Assistance and Poverty Reduction Legislative Augmentations

# Department of Social Services

Grant Increases – Provided \$44 Increase grants by \$10 per month anuary 1, 2017 (in place of the lost of living adjustment (COLA) In the Administration's proposal).
Dutreach for Enrollment – Provided General Fund on a one-time basis SI Disability Advocacy program. Emergency Food Assistance – 2 million General Fund to purchase meals for distribution at food banks t the state.

**Governor:** The Governor provided a one-time SSP COLA effective January 1, 2017 of 2.76 percent. Otherwise, these proposals were not included by the Administration.

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### Issue 6: Aging/Seniors and Persons with Disabilities Legislative Augmentations

### Issue 7: Child Welfare Services/Foster Care Legislative Augmentations

#### **Department of Social Services**

#### Assembly

- Emergency Child Care for Foster Children -Provided \$11 million General Fund (\$22 million ongoing) for emergency child care vouchers for newly placed foster children.
- Foster Youth Pregnancy Prevention Provided \$10 million General Fund for counties to expand these programs and provide an infant supplement for parenting foster youth.
- Modify Eligibility for THP-plus Provided \$5 million General Fund to allow for an expanded group of foster youth between 16 and 18 years of age to access these housing services.
- Chafee Education and Training Voucher Grants Provided \$3.6 million General Fund to allow for more eligible foster youth to receive this financial aid.
- **Continuum of Care Reform** Provided \$2.4 million General Fund for counties to implement the Resource Family Approval initiative in AB 403 implementation.

#### Senate

- Bringing Families Home Provided \$10 million General Fund for a county matching grant program to reduce homelessness among families that are part of the child welfare system.
- Public Health Nursing and Monitoring of Psychotropic Medication - Provided \$1.65 million General Fund for additional staffing of public health nurses to ensure that there is appropriate medication case management for foster youth.

Governor: These proposals were not included by the Administration.

## **Issue 8: Augmentations for Rehabilitative and Developmental Services**

	• State Operations. Augmented the DDS state operations budget by \$300,000 General Fund (available over three years) for contracting services to assist in the development of a performance dashboard on regional centers and the community-based services system.	

**Governor:** The Governor's Budget included trailer bill language regarding the retention of state staff. The Governor also proposed funding to create a Fiscal and Program Research Unit.
