Ballot measures


- In 2014, 71% of 59 "transportation" ballot measures were approved nationally (CFTE data)
- 2. Californian voters have approved:
 - Local-option sales taxes in 20 counties
 - Toll increase on Bay Area bridges
 - Local vehicle registration fee surcharges

8 MTI surveys on transportation \$


3 CA surveys (2006 & 2009)5 national surveys (2010 – 2014)

Gas tax variants (2014)




Who supports tax variants?

Virtually all groups prefer variants

Summary: public support

- 1. Raising transportation taxes/fees can be acceptable to the public, if carefully crafted
- 2. Increase support with taxes that are:
 - a. Local
 - b. Support specific projects
 - c. Support a specific <u>purpose</u>, especially maintenance, safety, and the environment

Recommended state actions

- 1. Raise the gas tax
- 2. Enable local government to raise money
- 3. Rely judiciously on PPPs and bonds for very specific projects, but not as sources of general transportation revenue
- 4. Evaluate mileage fees
- 5. Evaluate other promising revenue options (higher truck weight fees, etc.)
