John Laird, **Secretary of Natural Resources**, to discuss California's vulnerabilities to extreme weather events and other climate change risks, and the Statewide Adaptation Plan.

2) Are We Alone? A Look at Climate Policy Beyond California's Borders

Dallas Burtraw, Resources for the Future, to discuss climate action in the wake of Hurricane Sandy in the Northeast under the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative; examine potential for federal Clean Air Act performance standards for utilities and petroleum refineries.

Dirk Forrister, President, International Emissions Trading Association, to discuss market-based approaches to pricing on carbon being pursued in California and beyond.

3) Short-Lived Climate Pollution and Public Health: Black Carbon and Methane in Focus

Marc Fischer, Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, to discuss methane emissions in California and their contributions to local air pollution and global climate change.

Professor Rachel Morello-Frosch, UC Berkeley, School of Public Health, to discuss recent effort to identify disadvantaged communities that are uniquely vulnerable to California pollution.

Dr. Linda Rudolph, Public Health Institute Center for Public Health and Climate Change, to discuss the public health impacts of climate change in California, and from black carbon pollution in particular.

4) Are We on Track? Oversight of the Air Resources Board's Progress in Implementing AB 32

Mary Nichols, California Air Resources Board, to discuss greenhouse gas, and co-pollutant reductions since the passage of AB 32, direct regulatory measures implemented and pending, progress and challenges facing market-based mechanisms, and the Scoping Plan Update.
