

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Snapshot of Findings from AAAE Community Survey

- 81.5%: Never heard of Coordinated Care Initiative
- 27.3%: Not aware of programs for seniors
- 47.7%: Did not participate in programs for seniors
- **35.2%:** Wanted services that were missing



Snapshot of Findings from AAAE Community Survey

- 44.6%: Did not know how to use a computer
- 43%: No access to the Internet
- 23.9%: Not happy with quality of senior services
- 90.9%: More needs to be done to provide quality services to African American seniors




Size of Paid Direct-Care Workforce in California, 2012



By 2030, 3.5 million additional health care professionals and directcare workers will be needed nationwide...



Occupational Growth Projections for California, 2010-2020



Nationally, between 2010 and 2030, women aged 25 to 44 (the typical direct care worker) will increase by only 7%...



Over the next two decades, Los Angeles County will gain 867,000 older adults and lose 630,000 people younger than 25 years old...



The U.S. could have nearly 63,000 fewer doctors than needed by 2015.

That number could double by 2025.



Current and Future Geriatrician Shortfall

- 4.41 million: Number of adults 65 years and older
- 739: Number of certified geriatricians in 2011
- One geriatrician for ever 5,968 older adults
- 2,813: Number of geriatricians we need to train between now and 2030

Currently 80% of care is provided informally by friends and family members...



California Family Caregivers

- 4,020,000: Number of family caregivers
- \$47 billion: Estimated economic value of unpaid contributions in 2009
- \$14,711,105: Total FY2013 National Family Caregiver Support Program Funding in California

\$3.75 per caregiver in California


- 7.7 to 1: family caregiver ratio in 2010
