<b>AB 98</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Budget Bill Jr.</b> <i>This bill makes various budget changes to SB 69, the budget conference report that was passed in March of this year. The changes are generally consistent with the Governor's May Revision proposal. <b>NOTE: Passed by the Senate on 6-10-11; need reconsideration and amendment.</b></i>	<b>SB 71</b>
<b>AB 114</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Education Omnibus</b> <i>Makes various statutory changes to K-12, higher education, and child care programs that are necessary to implement provisions of the revised 2011-12 budget. <b>Note: Passed by the Senate on 6-10-11; need reconsideration and amendment.</b></i>	<b>SB 85</b>
<b>AB 21x</b>	<b>27</b>	<b>Managed Care Plans Tax</b> <i>Extends for one year the existing tax on total operating revenues of Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans. Results in about \$100 million in budget "solution."</i>	<b>SB 9x</b>
<b>AB 22x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Motor Vehicle Fees</b> <i>Redirects VLF funds used to administer Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to support public safety realignment instead; raises motor vehicle registration fees to backfill administrative funds at DMV. Results in about \$300 million in budget "solution."</i>	<b>SB 10x</b>
<b>AB 23x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Local Sales Tax</b> <i>Ends the "revenue exchange period" enacted as part of 2004's "triple flip" Economic Recovery Bond statute. Results in reinstatement of quarter-cent portion of the local sales tax. This, in turn, shifts property tax from local governments back to K-14 education, thereby reducing need for state to make up for loss to education. Overall, results in quarter-cent local sales tax. No loss of revenues to local government or K-14 education. Saves nearly \$1 billion in state General Fund costs.</i>	<b>SB 11x</b>

<b>AB 26x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Redevelopment, Part 1</b> <i>Eliminates redevelopment agencies and provides for orderly wind-down of RDA activities including payment of existing debt and the continuation of pass-throughs. The related bill (AB 27x/SB 14x) creates an alternative ongoing RDA program.</i>	<b>SB 14x</b>
<b>AB 27x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Redevelopment, Part 2</b> <i>Creates a voluntary alternative RDA program that allows existing RDAs to continue with reforms. The new program requires community remittances to schools, fire districts, and transit districts, of \$1.7 billion in 2011-12 and about \$400 million ongoing. Results in \$1.7 billion budget "solution."</i>	<b>SB 15x</b>
<b>AB 28x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>Sales tax enforcement</b> <i>Requires Internet sellers selling to California companies to collect sales tax on behalf of the consumer by establishing nexus.</i>	<b>SB 16x</b>
<b>AB 29x</b>	<b>21</b>	<b>State Responsibility Area Fees</b> <i>Creates a State Responsibility Area fire fee on landowners in SRA to help to defray costs related to fire protection provided by the State.</i>	<b>SB 17x</b>
