



Human Trafficking Los Angeles Statistics

- Los Angeles is a top point of entry to the U.S. for victims
- Ranks 1st in FBI's list of cities with highest incidence of sex exploitation of children
- The Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking (CAST) was established in LA in 1998
- 75% of the CAST clients served in 2014 were women & girls
- In 2015, there were 998 calls to the CAST hotline reporting trafficking
