Subject: Planned release of brood year 2017 juvenile winter Chinook Salmon from the

Livingston Stone National Fish Hatchery captive broodstock program

This notification is for the planned release of approximately 29,947 winter Chinook Salmon at the North Fork Battle Creek on Friday, March 2, 2018 (Table 1). This is the first planned release of more than 200,000 juvenile winter Chinook Salmon that will be released into Battle Creek this month. These fish are the progeny of captive broodstock from the Livingston Stone National Fish Hatchery. They are approximately 80 mm fork length and are 100% coded-wire tagged and marked with both an adipose-fin clip **and a left pelvic-fin clip**.
