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Sacramento River Fall-run

Projected return, absent fishing, is 133,242 hatchery and natural area adults

The PFMC establishes escapement goals for Sacramento River fall-run Chinook Salmon

- 122,000 minimum hatchery and natural area adult escapement

The minimum level of escapement is expected to be met based on the modeling

Sacramento River Fall-run

The 2017 season for the American, Feather, and Sacramento river:

2 bag, 4 in possession

The protective ocean measures allow for an in-river fishery in 2017

Sacramento River Winter-run

- Poor egg-to-fry survival in 2014 and 2015 are predicted to result in low adult returns in 2017 and 2018
- Low returns of adult salmon in 2017 and 2018 could take multiple generations to recover

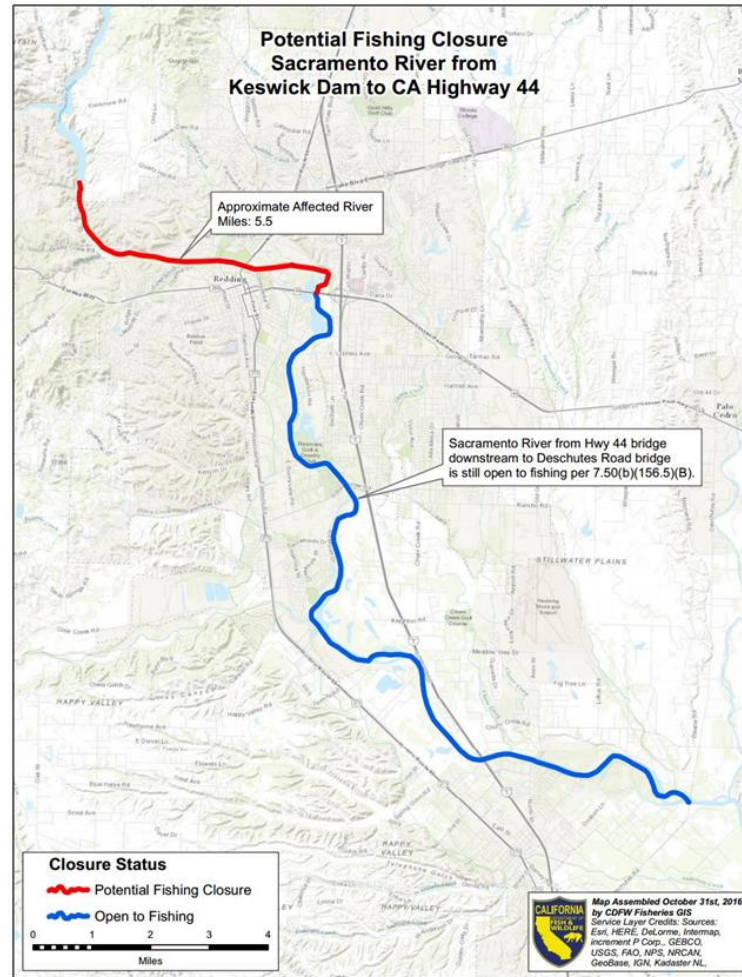
Sacramento River Winter-run

Proposed Winter-run Closure

**Keswick Dam downstream to Hwy 44
bridge (approx. 5.5 miles)**

- **April 1 – July 31 annually**
- **CDFW will annually assess success of all efforts to protect Winter-run**

Klamath Trinity Rivers Basin Fall-run

- Escapement goal for natural area adult spawners: **40,700**
- Projected return, absent fishing: **12,383**
- 2017 PFMC minimum escapement goal under *de minimis* fisheries management: **11,379**
- **Result: no recreational fishery in 2017**
