In 2013, legislation (Senate Bill 770) expanded eligibility to also include the following family members: parent-inlaw, grandparent, grandchild, and sibling.

Governor proposed trailer bill to make significant changes to the civil service hiring process. Strikes various statutes to expand the pool of candidates to be considered for promotions. Eliminates three requirements that impose restrictions on hiring managers. The Governor also proposed Control Section 4.11 be replaced with the Administration's authority to establish a process for reconciling departments' budgets based on actual expenditures and filled positions. Repeals Section 12439 of the Government Code—related to the elimination of chronically vacant positions. The Administration also indicated it will no longer propose the use of limited-term positions to address short-term workload, and instead will propose limited-term spending authority.
