The total project costs are expected to be \$1.2 million, with a \$500,000 pledge by the county, subject to the identification of matching funds.

Assembly approved 1) budget bill language authorizing the additional appropriation of up to \$15 million for improvements to the Tower Bridge, and 2) adopted placeholder trailer bill language authorizing the California Transportation Commission to relinquish the Tower Bridge to the cities of Sacramento and West Sacramento, provided that it is in a state of good repair that allows for the use of streetcars, as determined by the cities. This would allow the two cities to operate a streetcar line that connects downtown Sacramento and West Sacramento.

As a result, the state would incur a one-time cost, in exchange for no longer having to pay for future maintenance costs.

Fresno County Proposition 42 Maintenance of Effort Senate

Assembly approved trailer bill language to permanently eliminate the \$5.6 million Proposition 42 maintenance of effort requirement (MOE) for Fresno County.

SB 524 (Cogdill), Chapter 716, Statutes of 2010, exempted Fresno County from the Proposition 42 MOE requirement for 2008-09 and 2009-10. AB 2731 (Perea), Chapter 743, Statutes of 2014, granted Fresno County a five-year extension (to June 30, 2020) to meet its Proposition 42 MOE requirement, at which time Fresno County's General Fund would have to repay its road fund approximately \$5.6 million. This was done with the stipulation that the county shall expend no less than all of

the Proposition 42 MOE funds, \$5.6 million, to provide

specialty medical services to indigent individuals.
