Applicants who meet educational requirements but have not passed the test are given 90-day work permits, with which they can practice until they obtain their license. Board also has a pathway to licensure called "Education Waiver" for applicants who do not meet the current minimum education requirements, but qualify for an education waiver based on a combination of prior licensure, education and/or work experience (California Code of Regulations section 1399.330).
