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Ken Jacobs is the Chair of the UC Berkeley Center for Labor Research and Education, where he focuses on health care coverage, low-wage work and labor standards. Mr. Jacobs served on San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom's Universal Health Care Council and helped to develop the San Francisco Health Care Security Ordinance. He co-authored several studies on California Health Reform including, "Health Coverage Proposals in California: Impact on Businesses" and "Health Coverage Expansion in California: What Can Consumers Afford to Spend?" Ken is currently providing research and technical assistance to consumer and labor stakeholders and policy makers on health reform in California under a grant from The California Endowment.
