## Section 28.00—State Council on Developmental Disabilities

Pursuant to provisions of Section 28.00, 2020 Budget Act (Chapter 6, Statutes of 2020), the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received the attached Section 28.00 application from the State Council on Developmental Disabilities (SCDD) for the purpose of increasing Federal Trust Fund authority in Item 4100-001-0890 in the amount of \$458,000 for Program 3810-Regional Offices and Regional Advisory Committees. SCDD received the notice of award on April 29, 2021 and provided subsequent notification to Finance with 45 days. The funds will be used for the Developmental Disabilities Council program to conduct a wide range of vaccination-related activities, such as education about the vaccine, identifying people unable to independently travel to a vaccination site and arrange transportation, scheduling vaccine appointments, and reminding people of the second vaccination appointment if needed.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended toward providing a wide range of vaccination-related activities, consistent with state law.
- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditures proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- The need exists to expend the additional funding during the current fiscal year in order to comply with the terms of the federal grant.

Due to priorities and workload associated with the COVID-19 Pandemic resulting in insufficient time to execute this appropriation by June 30, 2021, we respectfully request that the 30-day waiting period requirement for this request be waived.

In pursuant of Section 28.00, SCDD requests to increase funding authority for program 3810- Regional Offices and Local Area Boards. The grant award of \$457,557 has been submitted to the federal government and that amount is CA state council's portion of the grant. SCDD, as directed, will use the grant award to conduct and expand a wide range of vaccination related activities such as education about the importance of the vaccine, identifying the underserved community of people with disabilities and elderly, help schedule vaccine appointments, arrange transportation, provide companion support, and provide technical assistance to local health departments and other entities on vaccine accessibility. This consideration will help the State Council's ability to reach more constituents and further our commitment and assistance to people with IDD in California.

#### JUSTIFICATION:
