

## **NUMBER OF LICENSED PROGRAMS**









As of December 2021, 14 Child Care Centers and 138 Family Child Care Providers are inactive. They are currently not caring for children, with uncertainty about reopening. This may result in the loss of an additional 2, 236 licensed slots in San Diego County.
