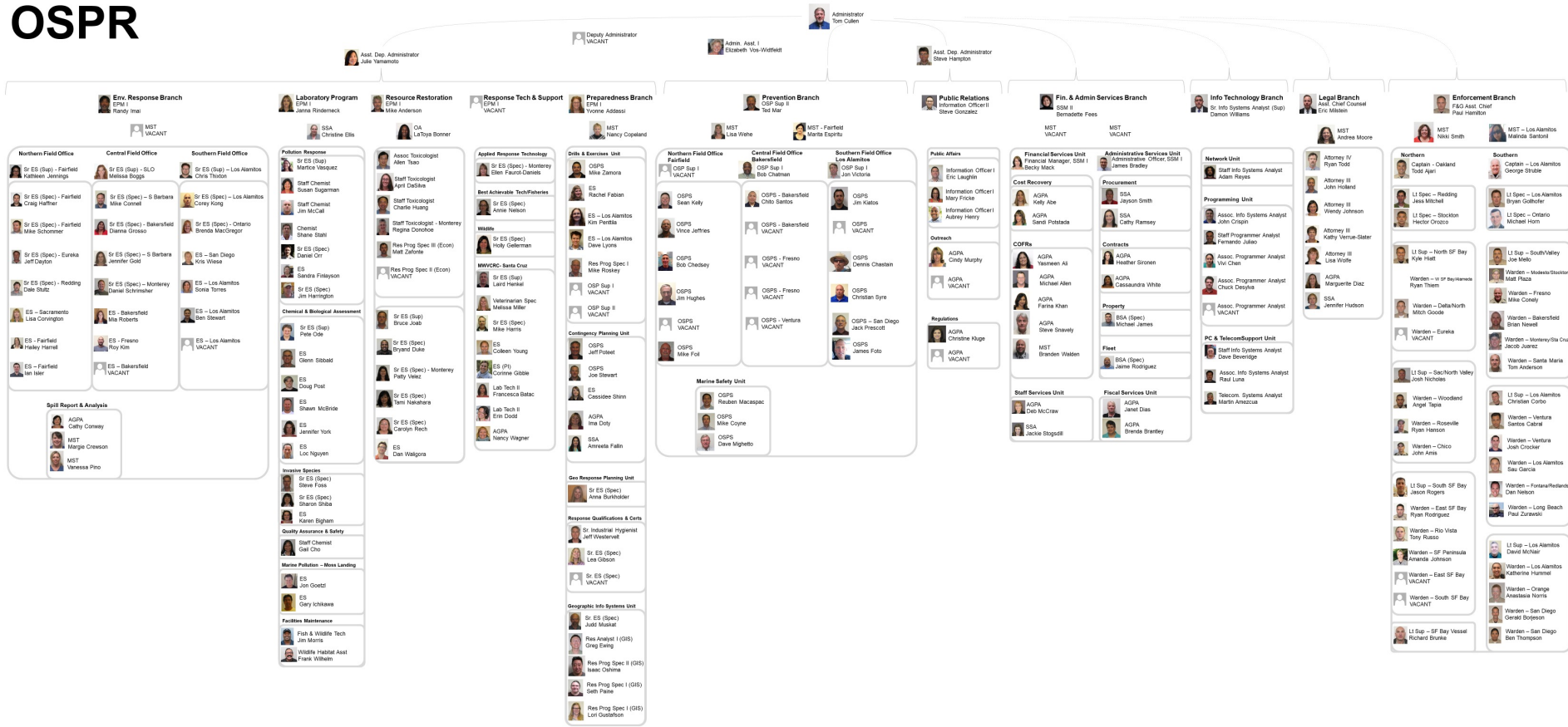
Office of Spill Prevention & Response

- Local Government Training and Coordination

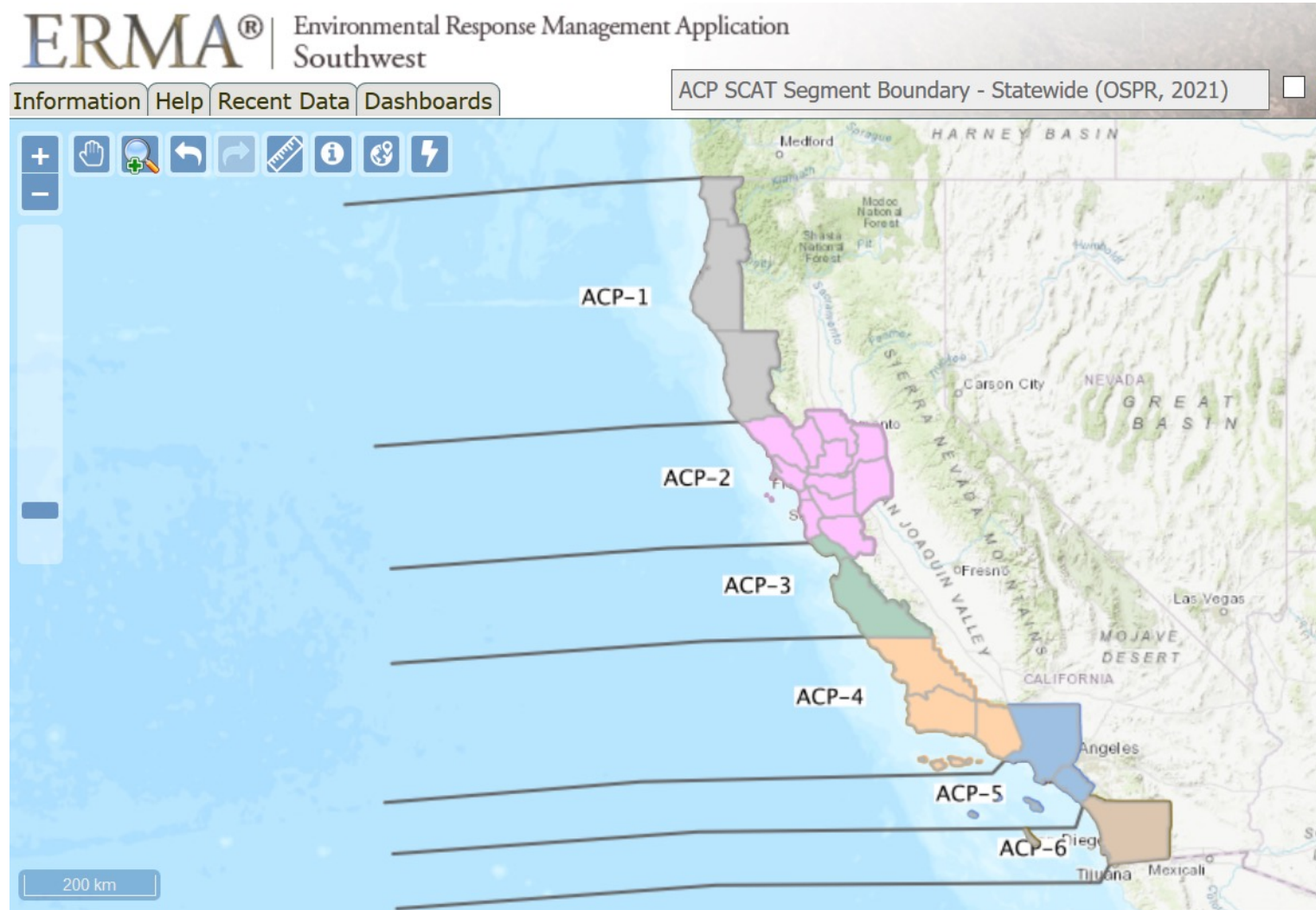
- Verify adequate safety measures and monitoring in place

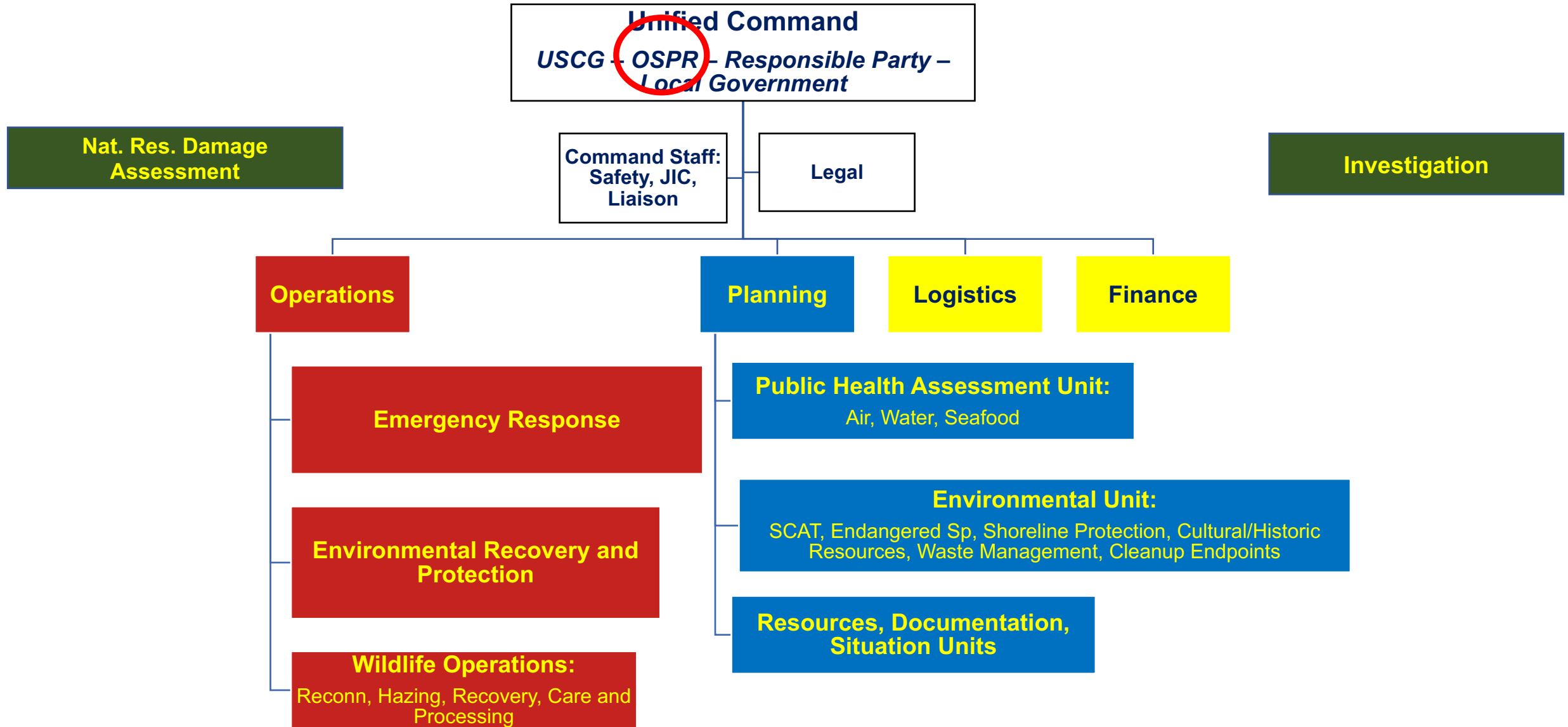
OSPR's efforts were limited to marine oil spills

Maritime Oil Spill Incident Command Structure

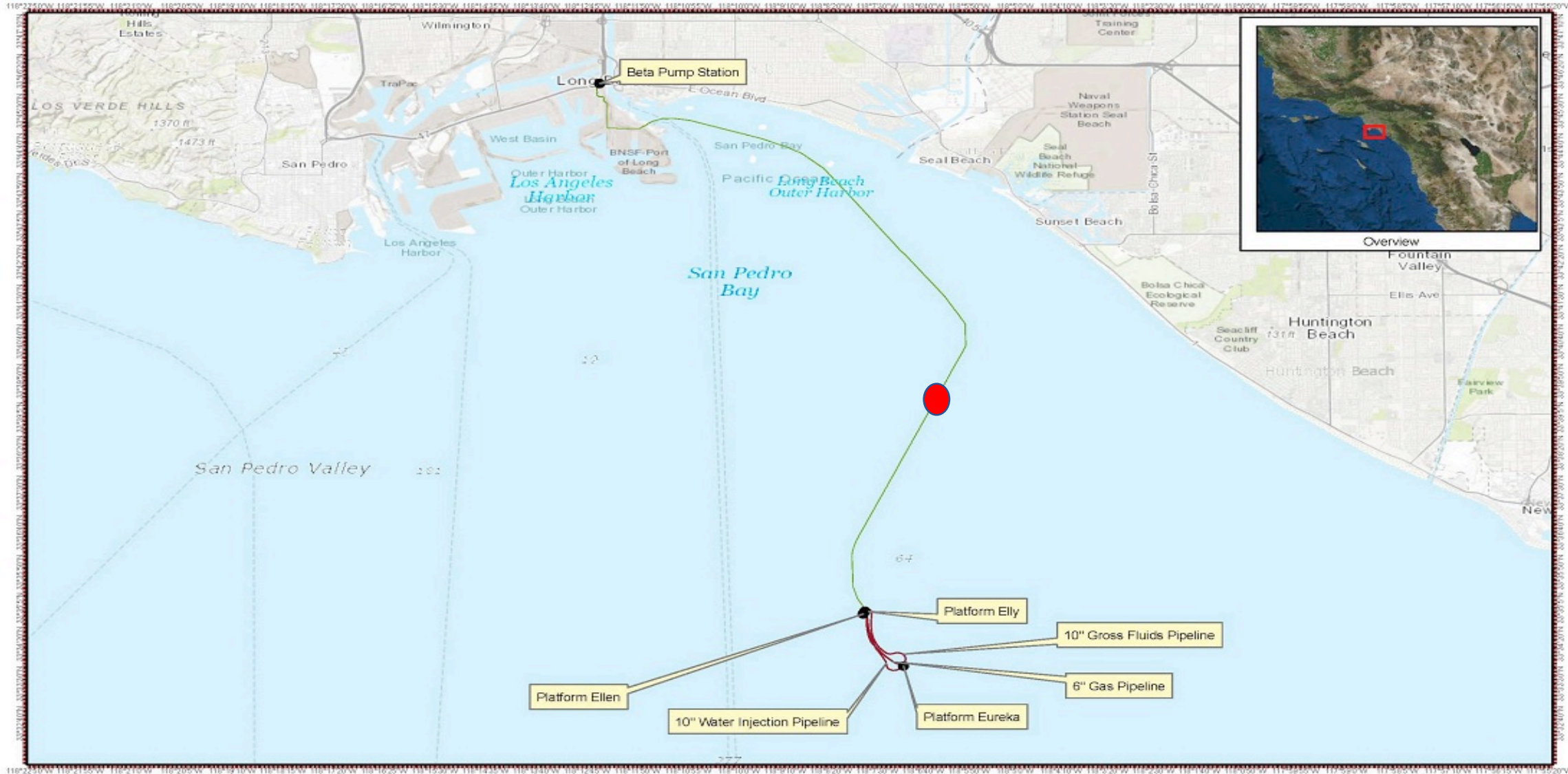


Oiled Wildlife Care Network (OWCN)

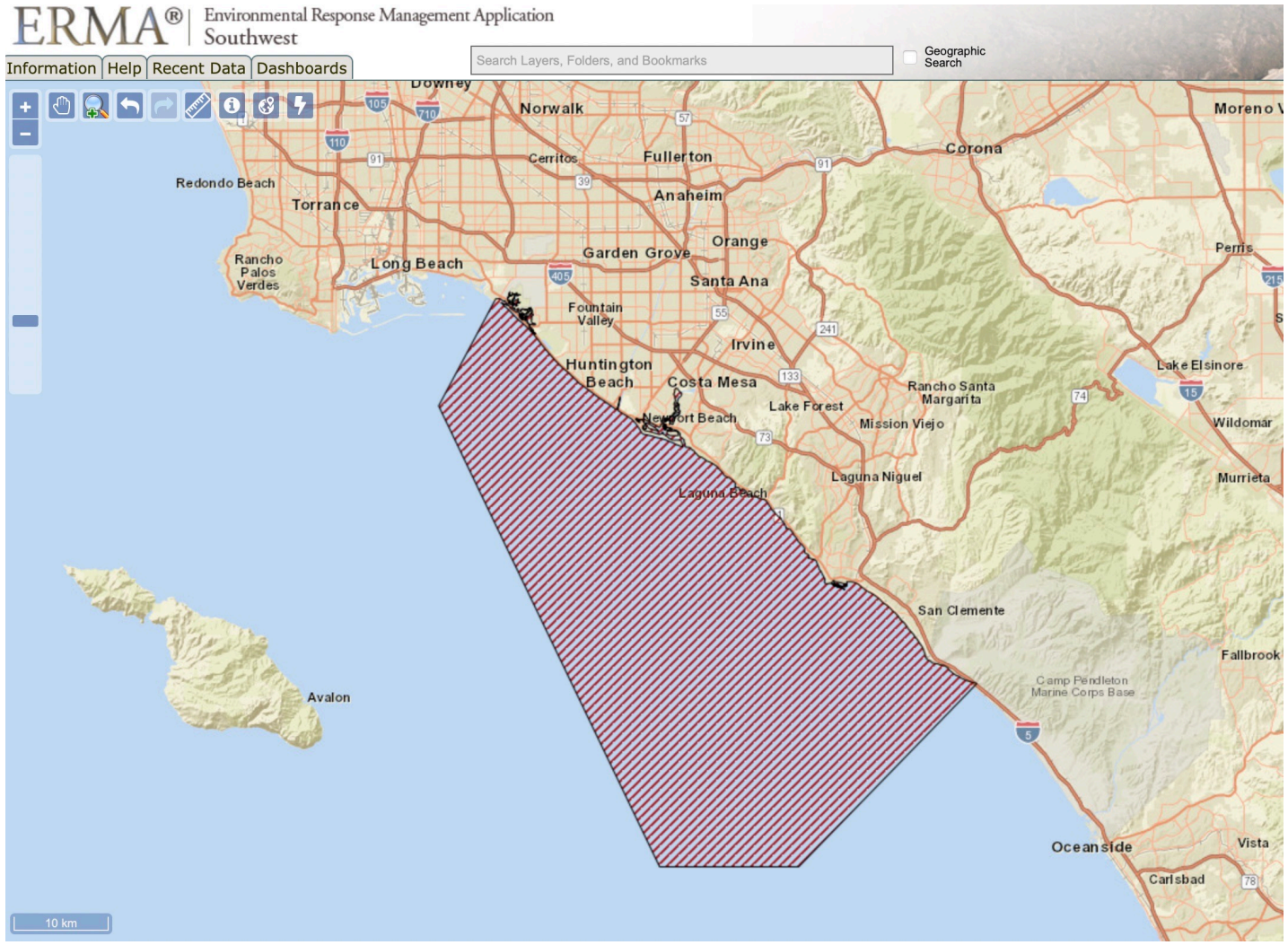

- Members of the public registered on OSPR's website: 10,000 (4,000 from Orange County)
- 561 volunteers were offered and 111 were trained in HAZWOPER
- 4 Community Volunteer Deployments
 - -Bolsa Chica State Beach South
 - -Bolsa Chica State Beach North
 - -Doheny State Beach
 - -Balboa Pier
- On average, 35 community volunteers attend each of the deployments

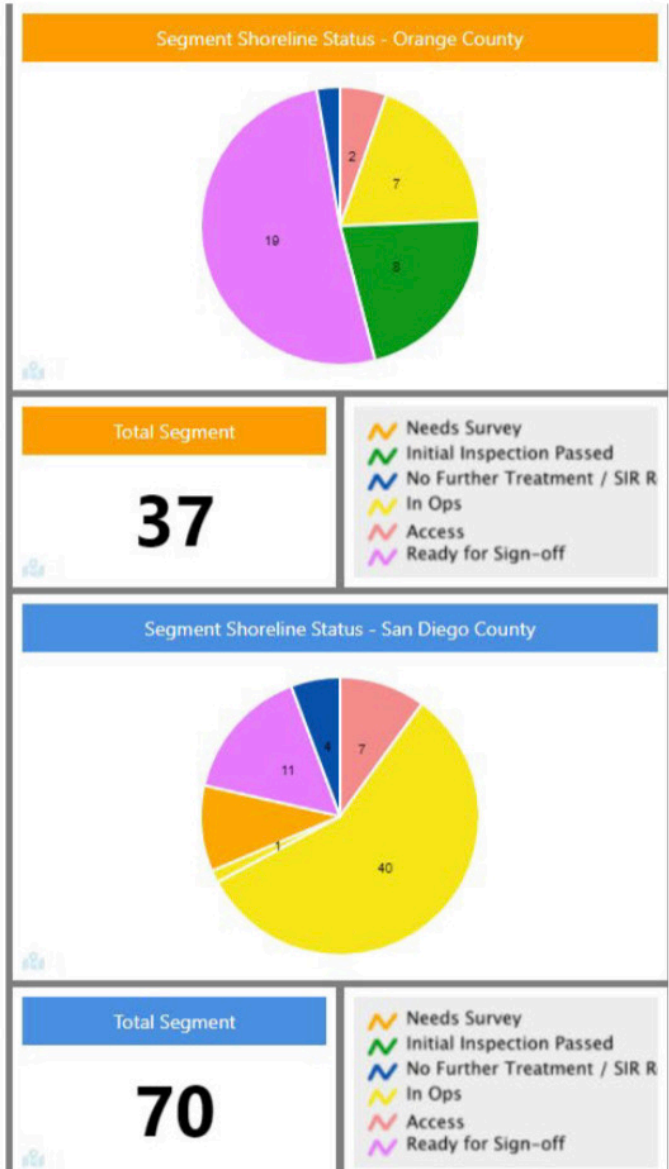
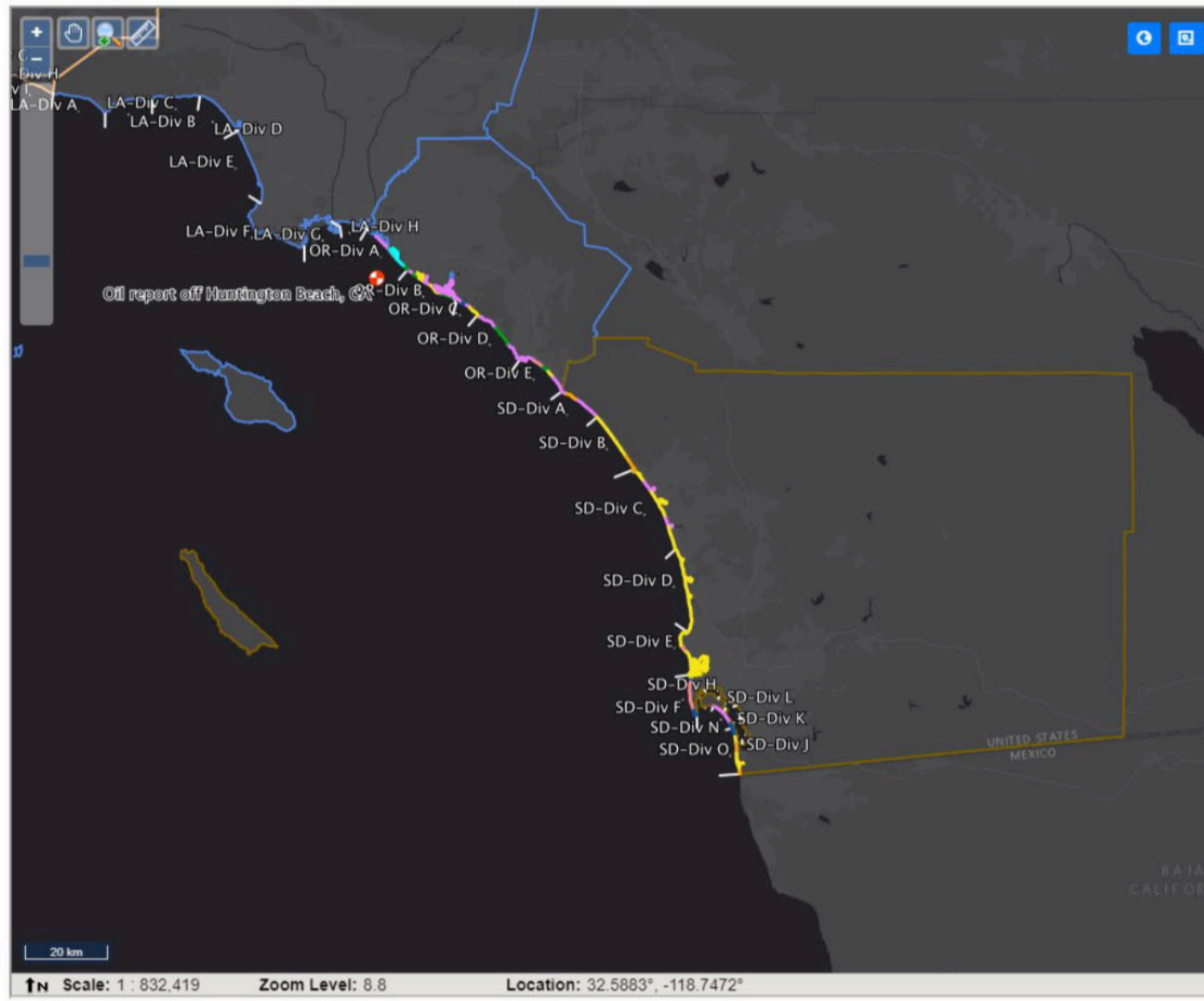
